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Terrorist Attacks of September 11, 2001

The purpose of the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program is to report the day-to-day crimes committed in the United States. The unprecedented events of September 11, 2001 did not meet this definition, and, as a result, the FBI has struggled with how to report the terrorist attack data to the American public.

In the 2001 edition of *Crime in the United States*, the FBI opted to devote a special section of the book to reporting statistics from the September 11th terrorist attacks. The Bureau did not include the statistics in state crime data for New York, Virginia or Pennsylvania.

In all, there were 3,047 deaths as a result of the events of September 11, 2001: 2,823 homicide victims were attributed to the attacks on the World Trade Center, 184 murder victims to the Pentagon, and 40 murder victims to the airliner crash site in Somerset County, Pennsylvania.
